I would encourage all of us to go through this program at least once! Currently there are over sixty people journeying through the program together – I am encouraged to see how God is working in many lives.

Deacon Care Team - I am so thankful for Roger and Bev McIver who give leadership to a committed team of people who care for people in our faith community who are in a time of need. We could use another couple or two to join us as we minister to people in our congregation. *Please see Deacon Care Report for more information.*

Marriage Retreat – We are having a Marriage Retreat on February 28, 29, March 1st. I am concerned that we continue to support and strengthen marriages in our community.

2019 was a really full year for the youth ministry here at Mount Olive. There were a lot of things to celebrate. Here are a few highlights:

- **Taco Tuesday.** We ran 10 of these last year and though we don't take attendance I would estimate we averaged around 130-140 kids every time.
- Youth Missions. I got to take a team of 7 youth to Big River Bible Camp in Northern Saskatchewan in the summer to minister to First Nations children. It was amazing.
- **PCA Chapels**. I get to be a part of PCA split chapels and speak to a group of boys once a month.
- **Coaching**. I've been coaching Jr. Boys Basketball at Three Hills School again and it has been great, as I've met tons of kids I didn't know!
- **Leaders.** We lost almost all of our volunteer leaders last year (most moved away) but God has provided a great new group! I have 12 amazing small group leaders and a couple extras that have been helping in other ways.
- **Growth!** This fall we saw our youth numbers increase dramatically and had two events with over 90 students (91 & 102)! Our Jr. High meets on Wednesdays and has been averaging 52 kids a night!

Thank you to everyone who faithfully prays for the youth in this town and also for my leaders, my family and me. You are making so much more of a difference than you likely realize. Please continue to pray for us or consider it if you don't. Pray that we can effectively reach the youth in this community that don't yet know Jesus and that we can help those who do plant deep roots that will make them devoted followers for life. Praise God for all that He is doing!

WORSHIP & ADDICTION/RECOVERY PASTOR

It has truly been a blessing to work alongside so many gifted and committed people over this past year. As most of you know my role as Worship Pastor includes overseeing Worship Leaders and their teams, Audio and Visual as well as Hosts (Ushers, Greeters, Information Desk and Service Hosts).

Here are the areas that we have addressed in 2019:

- We relocated the Sound Booth This change has provided additional seating in our sanctuary as well as allowed our audio, visual and lighting people to be in one area. This was a tremendous amount of work and could not have been done without the help of Ron Shaw. We now have upgraded cables to all our projectors including the chapel.
- Larger stage This has been a goal for several years now and with the reno project it gave us the opportunity to get it done. Along with expanding the stage we (Ron Shaw) also installed new stage boxes.
- Lighting Spotlights were installed so we have better visibility for those on the stage.
- Video We are now able to video our Sunday Morning Services and make them available on our website.
- Worship Teams Skye Williams has been part of the Kenton's Youth Team for several years and is now leading her own team! This gives us 4 leaders that rotate through the month and we are very blessed to have so many quality musicians and vocalists in our church.

Goals for 2020:

- Acoustical treatment for the sanctuary this has been a long time coming but, now that our sanctuary is painted, we will get started on this shortly. This will include upper back wall, upper side walls and backstage wall.
 Stage improvements – this will include improving the sound quality of our drums, adding monitor channels and carpeting.
 - We will continue to improve our streaming capabilities with the addition of a new computer as well as camera.
 - Training Now that the bulk of our reno's are complete we can focus more on training within all areas including Hosts, A/V and Worship Teams.

WORSHIP & ADDICTION/RECOVERY, CONT'D

I was recently at a Pastor's Luncheon in Calgary. When I shared with them that my role at our church was Recovery Pastor, everyone of them said, "I wish we had one of those". The question I often get here at home is, "are there really that many addicts in Three Hills"? Our church and community are full of broken people with broken families and I am truly grateful to be part of a church that recognizes this.

This past year has really been a learning one for me. I wasn't sure what to expect. Prior to joining staff in August of 2018, I was part of Conquer Series (a program for men struggling with sexual purity) but that was mostly the extent of my ministry in this area. I had a passion to serve but, would our community embrace the idea that the Church can be a safe place for healing?

Here are a few highlights from 2019:

- Conquer Series this program has been offered twice a year (September and January) for the past 4 years at Mt Olive. We generally have 8 – 12 new men each series. I also lead a series for a group of Collage guys each spring as well as high school age one on one. This is a 10-week program, but we continue to meet throughout the year for ongoing support and accountability.
- Genesis Process This is a one on one program for men and women caught up in drug/alcohol addictions. It is a 20-week relapse prevention program that I am currently working through with several people.
- Detox/Rehab Over the past year we have seen God expand our recovery ministry into our community. This generally involves a 5-10 day detox program (Renfrew Detox in Calgary) and then a long-term rehab program. We are blessed to have developed a great partnership with the Calgary Dream Centre and have seen several men enter into their 7week program.
- Messy and unpredictable It's difficult to fit broken people into a nice, convenient schedule. It may be phone calls at all hours of the night, trips to emergency rooms, a 6:00 AM drive to a detox centre or a relapse after 7 weeks in a rehab program.
- Our community is beginning to recognize Mt Olive as a safe place. I have had many calls from folks within our community (and outside) asking how they can help their addicted husband, wife, son, daughter, grand daughter or friend. That is very cool! We are receiving calls from other churches who are hearing about what God is doing at Mt Olive and what help in developing their own recovery ministry.

Counselling – we are blessed to have Tim Schellenberg working under KARN as an extension of our church. Tim is working on a master's degree in Addiction Counselling and has been a tremendous support in this area.

I have had several opportunities to share with other churches as to how they can be more effective in the area of addiction/recovery.

Recovery Ministries, Cont'd

Vision for 2020:

- Discipleship That's what this ministry is! It's one person walking along side another. It can be messy and inconvenient but it's what Jesus called us to do. We need people that are willing to be trained and then step into the blessing of seeing lives transformed into the likeness of Jesus.
- Freedom Session is a great ministry and has been a wonderful way to transition our church community through a process of healing and into a deeper relationship with God. We would also love to start another program called Celebrate Recovery. This program is more geared to the unchurched and is a great way to help people with hurts, habits and hang-ups. It would require a large volunteer base and it would be awesome if we could partner with other churches to spread out the load.
- Having Tim Schellenberg as part of our team has helped us realize how important professional counselling is to this work. Having both a male and female addictions councillor as well as someone to work with families as part of our church staff would be very valuable. I believe this could also be done in partnership with other churches.
- We would also like to broaden our reach into the community. Right now, the barrier to growth is just a lack of support people. Training and awareness will be a significant part of our plans for 2020.

We are seeing people find victory from their addictions and harmful behaviors. Individuals and families are finding true hope in Jesus and our community is recognizing that the Church is a place where people will find healing. Thank you so much for your support and prayers.

A program that has caught the attention of the community, is our summer camps which we ran again. A good percentage of kids enrolled in our camps program, were from non-church homes, making this a great outreach ministry for Mt. Olive.

In the past, our Sunday morning KidMountain Church has pushed the 100 in attendance But in the fall, we have experienced some growth and have been over the 100 person mark consistently.

In November 2019 we said "Good-bye" to Ang, our Children's Ministries Director for nearly 9 years, as she headed off to Olds to begin a new career in farming. Fortunately, the farm came with a husband! Nice work Ang!!

We are currently in the process of looking to hire a new Children's Ministries Director. We hope this position can be filled soon, but these situations can be fluid.

We are very thankful for ALL the volunteers that have stepped in to help run Kid Ministries and taken over the leadership holes that Ang left. A few people who have stepped into these leadership roles are Mary-Ann Bergen and Allie Smyth with Jericho Squad, Kristina Braim with overseeing our staffing and volunteer teachers, and many of you who have stepped up in other significant ways. - This past November we had Roxy Thiessen for a visit. She brought with her Bujin, who is the Director of Abundant Roots.

ELDER OF FACILITIES

Greetings from the Elder of Facility

This past year we saw a lot of changes cosmetically with the main floor of the church building as I'm sure all have noticed. These changes were long overdue and have modernized and brightened up the interior of the building. It is mostly completed but there are a few things that need to be finished up. The main thing left to do is to finish the main floor bathrooms which need painting, tile installation and some other finishing touches. There were a number of volunteers who spent many hours in this project and I would like to thank them for their service.

There is a lot of the upstairs that should be scheduled for an update as well now that we have two pastor offices on the second floor as well as an office used by KARN. There is currently no action plan in place for that, however.

A more pressing issue is dealing with a number of windows that should be replaced as well as well as the stucco. All the windows in the foyer should be replaced as well as most of the upstairs windows on the south side. In order for this to be completed in 2020 a plan needs to be set in place soon. An initial rough estimate came in at around \$200,000. We have used up the extra funds we had for the interior so a fund-raising project would be needed to pay for this.

We are now changing over to a new structure where there will no longer be an Elder of Facility. There will be Chair of facility which will look more like a small committee that will be responsible for the maintenance of the facility as well as future development. This committee will then report to a staff member and ultimately to the Elder's board.

DEACON CARE TEAM

The past year was a time of re-evaluation and re-building for the Deacons' ministry here at Mount Olive. Up until May of last year, we had been operating as a three couple team, attempting to meet the needs of a growing church community. Our focus was visitation to members who were sick (at home or in the hospital), ones who had undergone surgery or medical procedures, and ones who were grieving. This along with preparation and clean-up for Communion and Baptism kept us very busy. We felt there were many areas that we felt we should be doing more. There was an obvious need for an expanded team with a clearer understanding of its responsibilities and a plan for how they could be achieved.

Though we can't say that we have "arrived", there is a sense that we have come a long way in working towards reaching out in meaningful ways to meet the numerous needs within our church family. We changed our name to the Deacon Care Team (DCT), which reflects more accurately the ministry we have at Mount Olive EFC. Along with the pastoral team we reviewed and edited the job description to bring it up to date with where our church is now, and the direction the leadership wants to see it go.

We are now a team of 7 couples who are responsible to Pastor Murray Horton.

We are working together to find ways to minister to the needs of each 'family' unit within our church. One huge need was for us as a church family to get to know each other on a deeper level by developing relationships with those that we see at church functions. The tool that was put together for this purpose, under the leadership of Sheryl Haller and Beverley McIver, is our Church Directory. We presently have over 220 family units registered in our church directory. There are many attending that are not yet in our directory. We trust that you are finding it useful as you see people at church. You can reach out with confidence since you are able to now connect names to faces. The nature of our Directory makes future additions easy, so we encourage you to invite newcomers to get their information to us once they have decided to make Mt Olive their church home.

A major responsibility we have as the DCT is for visitation, but we can only visit if we know of the need. If you are sick, going into hospital, distressed or discouraged, and would like someone on our team to pray with you and offer friendship and encouragement, please contact the office and indicate that. They will advise us so we can call you and make arrangements for a visit. We also visit those who have lost loved ones. We bring a bouquet on behalf of the church, or there is the option to receive a flowering shrub in the spring to plant in honour of the deceased loved one. In January we met as a team for a training session on visitation of the sick and bereaved. We will continue to look for ways to learn and grow in our ability to help others.

We are involved in prayer for, and connection with, the church family on an individual basis. We desire that God use our words and actions, to encourage those that come thru our doors to become devoted followers of Jesus! Please pray for this ministry. If you are interested in being part of our team, please let us know.


