



## We Get To...

1. What insight, principle or observation from this week's message did you find to be most helpful, eye opening or troubling? Please explain.
2. Have you been baptized? If you have been baptized, tell your story of what led you to make that decision. If you are a follower of Jesus and not baptized yet, share what is holding you back.
3. Matthew 28:18 tells us that we baptize people "...in the name of the **Father** and the **Son** and the **Holy Spirit**."
  - a. **Father** denotes family – there are many verses in Scripture that encourage us how to relate to "one another" – what is a verse that is significant to you? Murray read 1 Thess 5:11 about being an encouragement to each other. Share with each other "who is in your corner" and "in whose corner are you?"
  - b. **Son** – Jesus came "**not to be served but to serve others and to give His life as a ransom for many.**" Jesus came to serve and save lost people like you and I and He encourages His followers to follow His example. What are some ways you can follow His example of serving people who are not yet part of the family of God? – be very practical!
  - c. **Holy Spirit** – Jesus told His disciples that the Holy Spirit "**will guide you into all truth.**" Murray suggested that a personal relationship with the Holy Spirit is crucial so that God can continue to "Gospel our hearts" – our journey in becoming Christ-like is life-long. He also suggested that this is discipleship!" What is your relationship with the Holy Spirit like? Do you hear Him speak to you as you read the Scriptures daily? Do you get close enough to people who are not yet family members to allow them to see God's work in your life?
4. Murray titled his message, "We Get To...". Why is motivation so important in our lives? What motivates you to live as a disciple/a life-long learner of Jesus? What are some verses that you can share that encourage us to live "gospel-infused" lives?
5. Discuss practical ways you can "...motivate one another to acts of love and good works." Heb 10:24
